A sunny Thanksgiving is due

Sunny skies and high temperatures in the 60s are forecast for the four-day Thanksgiving Day weekend that will be enjoyed by many Peninsulans.

Schools and state, county and city offices in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties will be closed Thursday and Friday in observance of Thanksgiving.

Federal offices will be closed Thursday but open Friday for busi-

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nesses and stores, including banks. Regular mail delivery will resume Friday.

On the eve of the holiday today, several community service agencies on the Peninsula were preparing for feasts for the needy and airports were preparing for the biggest travel period of the year.

A record half-million people are expected to travel through San Francisco International Airport

riod, according to airport spokesman Ron Wilson.

At least 130,000 travelers were expected at the airport today. Peak periods will be today, Sunday and Monday. Peak traffic hours at the airport are 7:30 a.m. to 10 a.m., 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. to 10 p.m. Travelers departing from San Francisco during the peak periods should check in 60 to 90 minutes before their scheduled flight time, Wilson said.
